

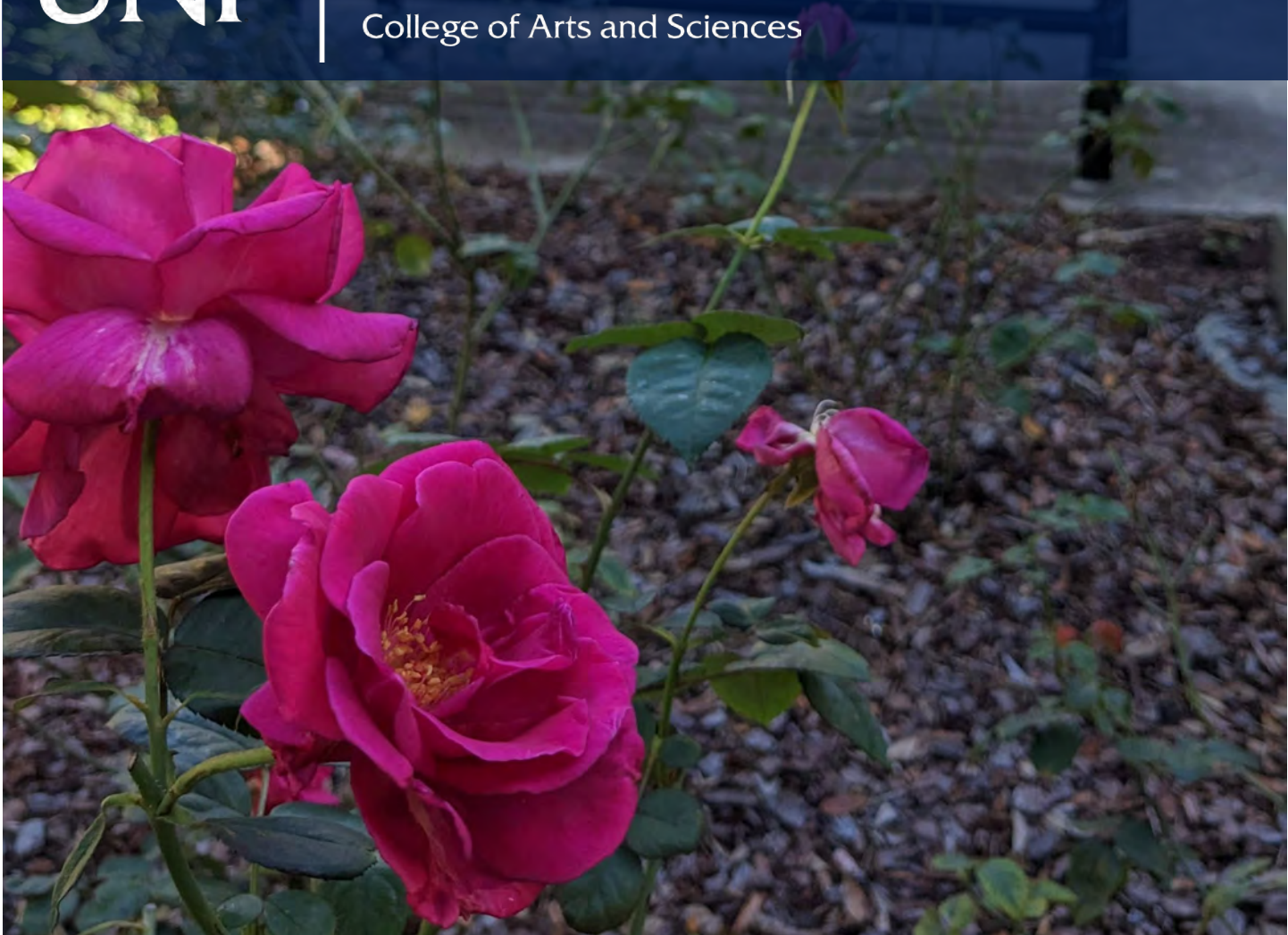

Student involvement is a core component of all PORL research studies, engaging hundreds of students every year across UNF colleges and departments. Working at PORL provides students with experiential learning opportunities, valuable skills in data collection and survey research, as well as a safe, comfortable on-campus working environment.

According to Institutional Research data, PORL student employees score consistently higher than the UNF average on four key Board of Governors' metrics.

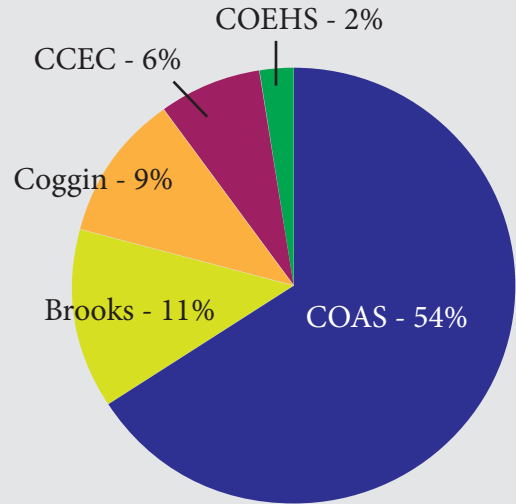

Project Highlights

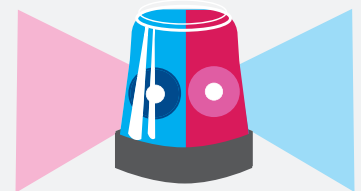
Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT)

69% of motorcyclists reported having seen or heard **Watch for Motorcycles** in the past year, compared to **46% of non-motorcyclists**.



50% of respondents who reported seeing **Click It or Ticket** in the past year saw it on a **traditional billboard**.

When asked the **most effective way to reduce drunk driving**, the most popular response was **increasing law enforcement and checkpoints**.



Florida Commission on the Status of Women



Healthcare and **economic security** are tied for the biggest challenge facing Florida women, each with **48%** of respondents.



Nonprofit Center of Northeast Florida

78% of respondents agree that the work of **local nonprofits** makes our community a **more desirable** place to live.



81% of respondents agree that **local nonprofits** can deliver social services and help people **more efficiently** than government.

Visit Jacksonville

Leisure guests account for the greatest percentage of hotel guests in the Jacksonville area, with an average of **35%**.



84% of hotels said they were **on or ahead of pace** to accomplish their goals for the upcoming fiscal year.

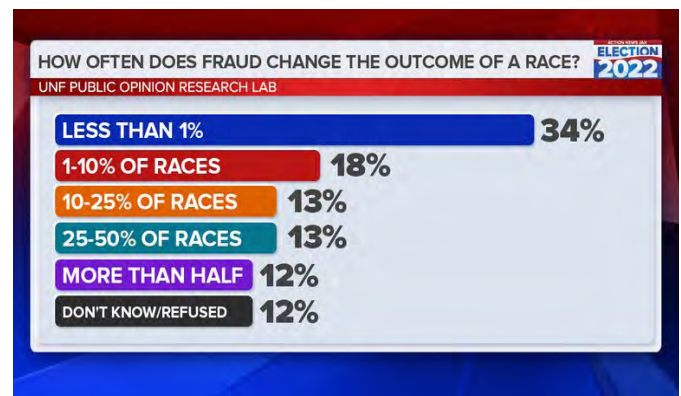
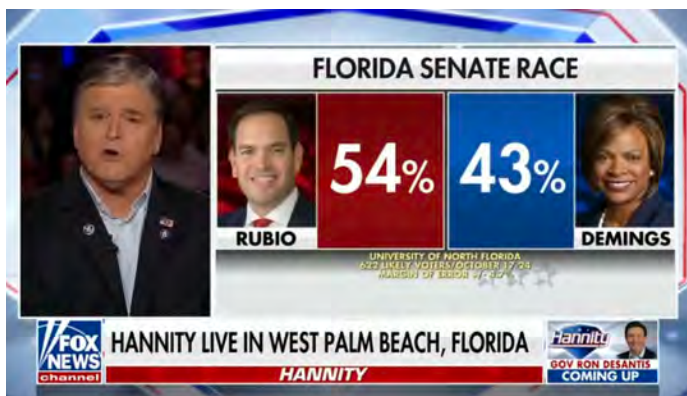
From crime to recycling, new UNF poll highlights Jacksonville’s biggest priorities

Aaron Bean takes double-digit lead in CD 4 poll

“This race has been on a lot of folks’ radar since CD 4 was redrawn earlier this year, especially given legal challenges and criticism of the new districts as watering down the Black vote in North Florida,” Mike Binder, PORL faculty director and UNF professor of political science, said in a statement. “Not only has L.J. Holloway likely feeling some of these redistricting effects as a Black Democrat, but she’s also been far outspent by Bean on the campaign trail.”

The findings published by the Public Opinion Research Lab (PORL) at the University of North Florida (UNF) meanwhile found a “majority of respondents”, or 57 percent, in opposition to the bill “either strongly or somewhat.”

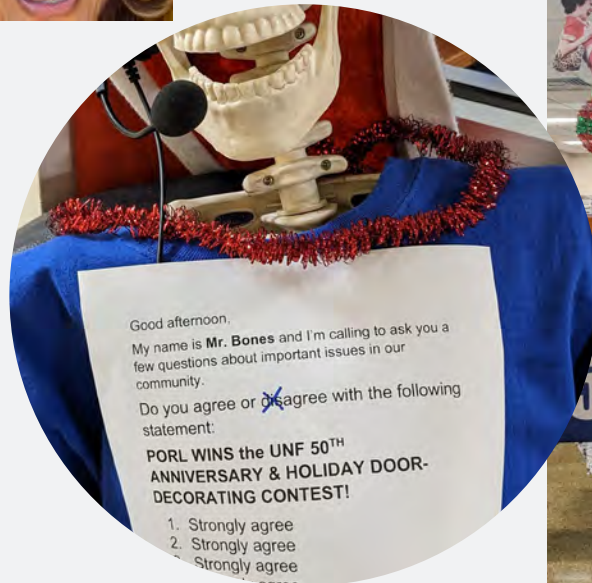

Eva Sonnenberg Matthews, Research Coordinator

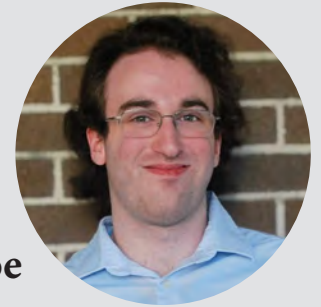
